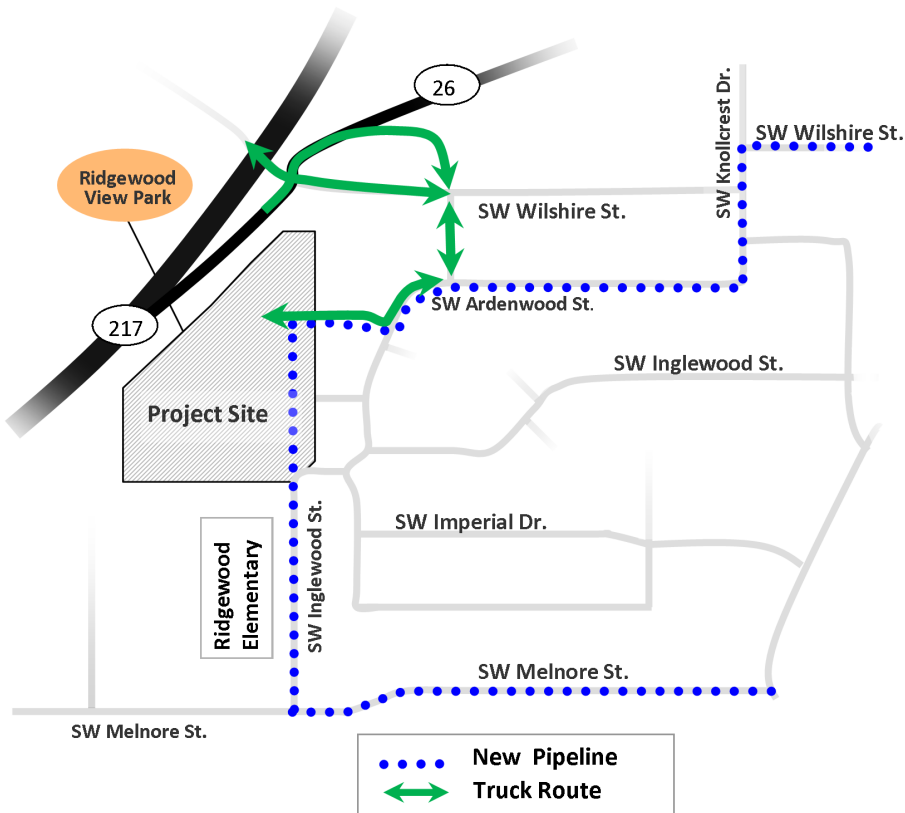

Ridgewood View Park Reservoir & Pump Station Project

Tualatin Valley Water District has selected Stellar J, an employee-owned construction company based in Woodland Washington, as the contractor for the Ridgewood View Park Reservoir & Pump Station project.



Key Construction Information

- Stellar J will limit construction to 7:00 am to 6:00 pm and will secure special permits for any weekend work. Stellar J will notify neighbors of weekend work in the weekly email notification and on the website.
- Stellar J will fence the site for safety and security purposes.
- Stellar J work in Ridgewood Elementary School parking lot will be completed during summer 2015 during non-school days. Some preparation work will be completed in the school parking lot during Spring Break 2015.

Delivery and Haul Routes

- Constructing the new water storage tank and pumps will require delivery of materials and hauling away of demolition debris and excavated soil. Trucks will be restricted to the haul route indicated on the map and will operate only during approved construction hours.

Pipeline Construction

- A new pipeline will be built to connect the reservoir to the existing water system.
- Pipeline construction is expected to begin in the spring of 2015 and last about six months. Trenching and laying pipe will be completed in approximately 150-200 foot sections. Each section is expected to be completed by the end of each day.
- Trenches will be covered at the end of each day. Flaggers will be present to direct local traffic. The contractor will provide 48 hour notice of any daytime driveway impacts.

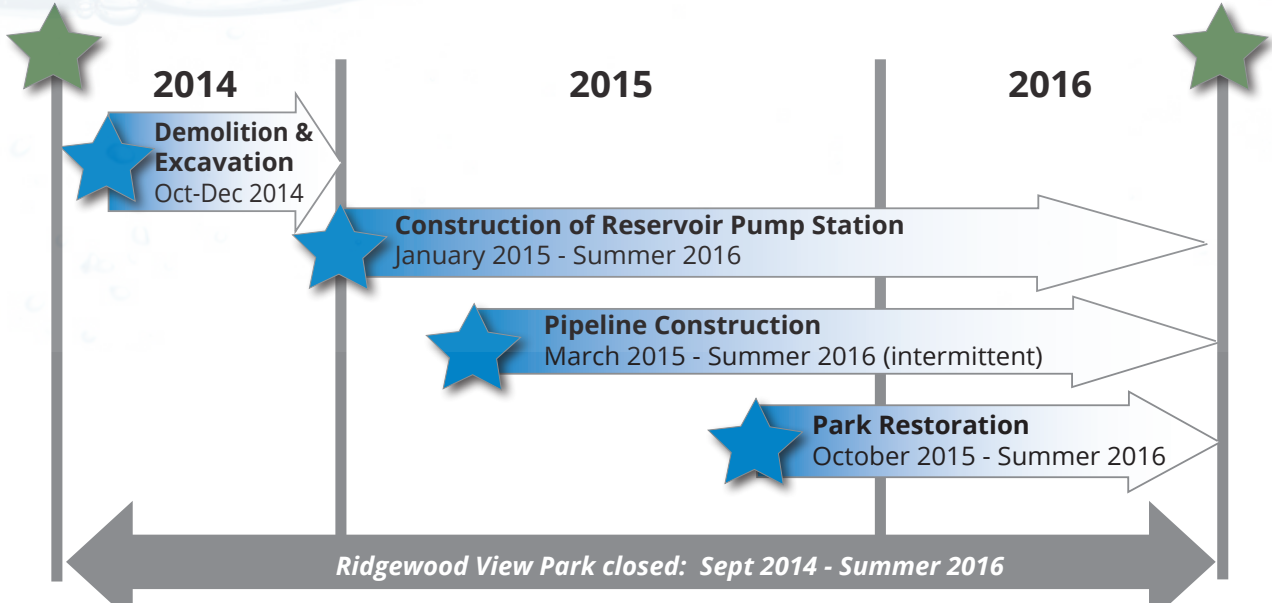

Ridgewood View Park Restoration Final Design

The northern portion of Ridgewood View Park will be completely closed to the public and used as a construction staging area beginning October 2014 and will remain closed through project completion in the summer of 2016. The natural forest area will remain open from the south except during trail construction. The northern work area will be fenced to ensure the safety of neighbors and protect construction materials and equipment. The new park will be rebuilt following the plan developed collaboratively with neighbors during the project's planning and design phase.
