




# Ridgewood View Park Reservoir & Pump Station Project

The Tualatin Valley Water District (TVWD) is beginning a project to improve the reliability of the water supply for public use and fire protection serving the West Hills area.

The aging Hyde Park reservoir was decommissioned in 2011 due to structural concerns. The Inglewood reservoir and pump station are also aging. The condition of this infrastructure prompted the need for improvements in your area. Early planning work identified a number of feasible options, including:


- Replacement of the existing Hyde Park reservoir and the Inglewood reservoir with a reservoir and pump station at a new Ridgewood View Park location.
- Rebuilding the Hyde Park and Inglewood facilities in their current location.



In addition, restoration and park improvements at both Reservoir and Ridgewood View parks will be included.

## Project Schedule

TVWD is currently in the process of evaluating alternatives to replace the deficient storage and improve the parks at the same time. An alternative will be selected by early 2013 and then the design phase will occur from Spring 2013 through the end of 2013. TVWD's goal is to have new facilities constructed by the Spring of 2015.



# Next Steps

## ● *Site Analysis*


In order to determine where to locate the facilities – a new Ridgewood View Park location or at their current locations, TVWD is conducting a variety of work at both sites. The information collected will be considered when selecting a site and during project design.

- **Soil and bedrock exploration**  
*The team will study the soil beneath the sites to ensure adequate foundations for reservoir structures. Understanding the subsurface conditions and materials is a key step in designing earthquake resilient facilities.*
- **Wetland mapping**  
*By determining the limits of waterways and wetlands at each site the team can develop a design that minimizes impacts to natural resources.*
- **Arborist tree assessment**  
*Preserving park trees is important to this project. An arborist will assess the condition of existing trees at each site to be considered in the project design.*
- **Surveying & utility locations**  
*Surveying ultimately determines the location and elevation of all site elements including vegetation, roads, buildings and utilities.*
- **Noise monitoring**  
*This determines the current ambient noise level at each site, which will be considered in pump station and reservoir design alternatives.*

## ● *Select Site for New Facilities*

To implement parks improvements and provide open, inviting, and functional park spaces, a Parks Master Plan will be developed for Ridgewood View Park and Reservoir Park. TVWD will work with Tualatin Hills Park & Recreation District and the public during the plan development.
